

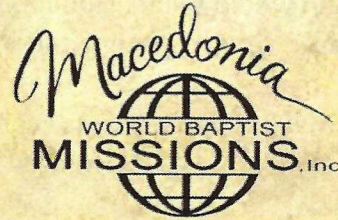

It is hard to believe that on the first of March we were in the US. We are so thankful to have been able to be there for the birth of Levi and MaryLou's first baby. Also being able to spend a few hours with our grandson, Samuel, as well as getting to see all the kids and our parents even if only for a short time.



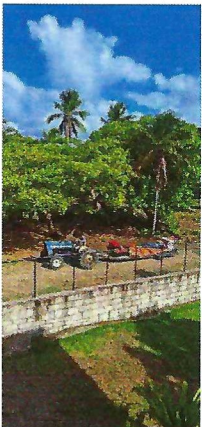
Coming into Honduras on our way out here, we were able to stop in town and buy supplies to be shipped out for the new Spanish mission. While that particular job was waiting for supplies, we were able to hold special Easter (Holy Week) services at our church Wednesday through Saturday each night, ending with Sunday morning Easter service. We began preaching of events leading up to the crucifixion of Christ and have continued preaching through the story line till the last part of April. I personally enjoyed the study and opportunity to preach those messages. The Lord began to point out some things in each event that I had not focused on before.



The next week the boat of supplies came in and it was time to get to work fixing up the building for the Spanish work. The building was, what is called, dried in and we were able to start from there. Electric being the first job since it is inside the wall structure, then covering the walls with plastic to keep rain from getting to the sheetrock. Sheetrock hanging, mudding, and painting was next, then the ceiling. We still have more painting and some work inside to get done, and are hoping for the last of May or first of June to start holding services.



The Spanish Bibles made it here in April as well. We are anticipating visiting all around the area of the mission handing out the gospels of John that came in. They have a great plan of salvation in them, and they have the verses marked in order as well. The new Testaments we plan to wait and hand out in the services, with the whole Bibles waiting for those who start coming regular. We praise the Lord for \$200.00 more that came in this month to help cover the cost of the shipping. An individual lady gave \$100, and a ladies prayer group gave another, both from TEXAS. Thank you, Texas!!!



This month of April we have been teaching two-hour night classes for Levis, our institute student. The classes are open to anyone who wants to come. We began with 8 students and have two nights left. It looks like we will have 6 that will finish the class. We are studying the book of Revelation. In 36 hours of class time and only 30 of teaching time, the course is just an overview of the book. We have gone back to Daniel, Ezekiel, and some other OT books a few times just for clarity and explanation. Mostly



looking at the events and their order of occurrence during the end times. Each night at some point I have been able to make a plea for folks to be saved. Hearing and reading of the judgments and joys to come should make one cry out for salvation(I would think). God has to do the work in the heart of each person. We just pray that each night, each plea, each service, each witness is another strike with the hammer of God's Word to the hardened heart.

The last part of May we had a trip upriver planned with Bro. Sexton. Due to time constraints it has turned into something else. Lord Willing, we will be meeting across the bay in Puerto Lempira with our 5 pastors and holding classes for three days at Bro. Andy's church there. We ask that you pray especially for this time that the Lord will help us have wisdom in our classes and teaching. Each of these men have churches that they are trying to grow both in people and in buildings. Andy and Humer each have two churches they are working in. I am in a quandary to figure out if hearts here are just ignorant of the truth or hardened to it. Either way their hearts have been blinded by the god of this world. The only hope for them and all of humanity is for the Holy Spirit to be allowed to shine a glimmer of the glorious light of the truth in to their hearts. Preaching, teaching, visiting, helping, making friends, all of these things are an effort or means by which the Spirit can have that chance to convict and convince of sin and salvation.

These next couple weeks of May I will be studying to be ready for the class time. Also, in the mornings, I hope to be working toward getting the Spanish mission ready for services. We are in the last part of dry season, so I also need to get the tractor out and do some major work on the path in front of the house here, lifting it up about 2 more feet so folks can get to church (and other places) without having to wade through the water once the rains come.

Thank you for your prayers during these two months. The Lord has allowed us to be able to get a lot done both physically and spiritually as well. Thank you as well for your prayers for our daughter, Lydia. as she was in Bolivia helping a missionary family there and had a safe trip back to North Carolina as well. Pray that the Lord will give her clarity and understanding of His will as she goes forward for Him. We ask for your continued prayers as we plan for the work and classes coming up in the month of May.
