Greetings dear praying friends and family! Hope your summer is going well. I would imagine it is busy. Ours is so far as well. Hopefully you have found time to enjoy the summer in between all the busyness. Our daylight doesn't last quite as long as it may where you are, but it's still longer than at other times of the year and we are loving it. Logan is excited to be finished with his first semester and be on break for the summer. He also had his birthday in May. He is now a 5 year-old!

We just got back from our annual week-long summer camp. I thought it went well! Kelsie and I got to help with games in the Junior Camp, and I had the privilege to preach the final message for the regular teen camp. There were multiple decisions for salvation and for surrendering to ministry. I do not have the final statistics but it was encouraging to hear what the Lord has done in the lives of the young people throughout the week. The next event on our ministry calendar is VBS. I will also again be preaching out at another church in a few weeks.

We don't have as much to report in this latest letter. Much of these two months have been "business as usual," with regular preaching, outreach, discipleship/one-on-one teaching. I have been preaching through the book of Revelation for the last two months. Our people are responding to the Word - asking questions and taking steps in service, and the Neipu church is experiencing growth. With all the day to day family needs, Logan's school drop-off and pick-up, ministry needs and my various appointments, we were finding ourselves needing to often cut short meetings with people we were trying to reach or train to make the vehicle available for other apoointments.
