GREAT START FOR 2025: Prayer Requests

We approach this year with expectation that God will bless His work at Mission to Burma. We have a vision but ask you to pray for us for God's vision to be our vision. Our vision entails both reaching the lost and edifying the saints. **REACHING:** First, we have hopes for a doubling of students in our ESL courses. We also pray that by increasing our effort in discipleship in the ESL/Bible school God will bless us with more sheaves to leave at His feet and <u>added to the church</u>. Next, we pray that we can continue to support providing Gospel material and Bibles to needy Burmese churches, missionaries, and Christians. We also pray for our radio program to grow and reach many for Christ. Finally, we earnestly supplicate at God's throne for more opportunities to reach youth and pray for His leading as we begin to seek His will for a children's Christian school for refugee children, to provide hope for those caught in a pit of despair. **EDIFYING:** We ask the Lord to help us as we start our new series of Burmese Pastor conferences this year to bring solid Bible doctrine to a land suffering from misleading voices and false doctrine. Please pray for us. What follows is a brief report:

English as a Second Language (ESL)/ Bible School:



Good News! Our outreach has brought us close to 80 students for the Spring Semester 2025. These are 80 mostly young people, many college and high school students, some professionals, Buddhists, Muslim, and cultural Christians who don't know Christ. We have students in Indonesia, Malaysia, Burma, Thailand, Singapore in cities and villages where it is virtually impossible to reach but where there is internet. We have them for 15 weeks of the Gospel with online quizzes and exams, intensely learning the doctrines of our faith. What an opportunity. ESL programs are used all over the world to reach the lost. And this program is intense, using

Moodle as an online platform (used by major US universities), with video, speech recognition, online class with me and Sherrie as teachers. We have already seen wonderful fruit and pray that our new focus on increasing our student body, praying with students and discipleship will bear much fruit. This program is quite labor intensive (we have 4 assistants) and we have no direct support for it. Any support the Lord leads you to give will be a blessing.



The Pastor Conferences 2025:

We have two five-day conferences scheduled for this year. The first is on the book of Hebrews, a repeat of last year's successful conference on "Revealing the Mysteries of the Epistle to the Hebrews", in which we cover the entire book of Hebrews including difficult passages. I really enjoy teaching the epistle to the Hebrews. And in November I will be teaching "The Epistle to the Romans: A Theological Study", verse by verse. I have been preparing for this for months and will be ready to open this theological pearl in November.
