

## February Prayer Letter

**Family Update:** This week, we are taking Lyssie (the 9- year-old daughter I mentioned in my previous prayer letter), to **Cape Town** to see a doctor who specializes in seizures. Because of the safety and logistics of it all, the entire family, plus one foster child, and us two interns will be driving down together. **Please pray for safety** for this 8 hour drive and **for wisdom** as the Bergeys continue to seek out medical care for their sweet girl.

**Ministry Update:** The Lord has continued to work in lives through the new **church plant** in **Kuyga**. On Thursday afternoons, we reach the children & teens of this township with a fun activity and a message from God's Word. Over the past few weeks, we have been able to see this **youth group** expand from 30 children to over 90! We praise the Lord for giving us this opportunity to minister to the young people of Kuyga and pray that soon, we will be able to reach the parents of these children!



**During these past few months, the Bergeys have consistently helped me to become involved in each ministry.**



I'm not going to lie. Getting up in front of a group of people & being the center of attention has **never** been my cup of tea. But it wasn't Moses's "cup of tea" either, and God still used him. Each week, as I share my testimony, sing a special, lead a game, or teach a Bible lesson, I am, again, reminded that **ministry isn't always comfortable or easy**. And that's **exactly** how God wants it. He **wants us to trust** solely on Him. He **wants us to see** how He can use the **weak** things of this world to **confound the things which are mighty**.
